2009 KANSAS OPEN REPORT AND PICTURES

The 2009 Kansas Open, July 10th to 12th, was held in Lindsborg, Kansas. Both the Bughouse and the Kansas Quick championships were held July 10th at the Karpov Chess School. The Open and Reserve Championships were held July 11th and 12th at the Bethany College Lindquist library meeting hall. This year's participation in the main events of the Kansas Open was up from the previous years. There were 33 in the Quick event and 58 total participants in the Open and Reserve events (20 in Open section and 38 in the Reserve section). The Bughouse Championship had 8 teams of two players.

The **Bughouse Championship** had a clear first place team. The team of **Kyle Sciolaro and Danny Tran are our new state Bughouse champions**. In the seven round robin event their team won all seven of its games.

Like the Bughouse the **Quick tourney** had a clear first place winner in the 5 round Swiss tourney. **Conrad Holt** won all five of his games. **Conrad is our 2008 Kansas Quick Chess Champion.** There was a four way tie for second place with Tom Brownscombe, Maxx Coleman, Ken Fee, and David Blair. Alex Hall (MO) was first place scholastic and Bryan Jiang was second place scholastic.

The **Open section** was a clear win by Tom Brownscombe with 4.5 points out of 5 possible (4 wins, 1 draw). **Tom Brownscombe is our new 2009 Kansas Chess Champion.** Christopher Purdy and Tim Steiner finished tied for second place with 4.0 points.

The Reserve section was won by Colby Stuckman. He is our new Kansas Reserve champion. He finished alone at 5 points out of 5 possible, winning all of his games. In second place by himself was young Tony Cheng with 4.5 points. Tied for third were Bylthe Buscher and Alex Esposito (MO) at 4.0 points. The scholastic winners were first place Peter Bradshaw, second place Bryan Jiang, and third place Jantz Chappel.

Thanks to tournament director Tony Dutiel. Thanks once again to the Karpov Chess School and Bethany College for the use of their facilities. Once again we recognize that many participants in the 2009 Kansas Open also participated in the Karpov Chess camp in Lindsborg. The camp ran the week after the Kansas Open.
