KANSAN FM CONRAD HOLT EARNS THIRD IM NORM

Wichita FIDE Master Conrad Holt participated in the recently completed Berkley International tourney in Berkley, California. The tourney ran from January 2nd to 8th 2011. Conrad finished tied for 4th to 10th place with 6.5 points out of 10 possible. He had 6 wins, 3 losses, and only 1 draw. The tournament is significant for Conrad in that it was his third IM norm. Thus, according to recent communication with Oklahoma FIDE International Arbiter Frank Berry, Conrad should be given his International Master Title by FIDE some time in May. To the best of this author's knowledge Kansas has never had an IM or GM titled player. Surrounding states have, but Kansas has not. Send me a note if I am wrong.

The High School Senior was busy in 2010. He played in the 2010 US Junior Invitational tourney 7/10-7/19 in St Louis. He also played in the Mid-America in St. Louis, Chicago Open, World Open in Philadelphia, Philadelphia International, Copper State International in Mesa, Arizona, and Continental Class in Arlington, Virginia. Closer to Kansas Conrad finished first place in the Oklahoma Thanksgiving FIDE tourney November 20th and 21st, 2010 with a perfect score of 5 out of 5, a tourney directed by Frank Berry.
